Community Support

Our service helps people who might feel isolated, need companionship, or would like to re-engage with community activities. Our trained staff provide an opportunity to expand your life choices.

We work within your own home and the local community. Tynwald's support of your individual needs is based on a social rehabilitation model where you are in control.

Working with you

We assess your specific needs, producing an agreed plan to help you begin enhancing your day-to-day life. Our service is always participative, working closely with you, encouraging and developing your independence at all times.

Social Rehabilitation

Social rehabilitation supports agreed goals to improve social, communication, cognitive and physical skills, build self-confidence, and a local support network, where you can start to develop new opportunities in a safe and supportive way.

Health & Wellbeing

We understand that mental and physical health challenges can sometimes make taking positive steps difficult. We will facilitate meaningful activity, and for some people, we offer support in maintaining family relationships, friendships and varied community opportunities, hobbies and interests.

Your imagination inspires the well-being of the body and mind, and our support, balanced by the importance of healthy eating and exercise, promotes a better quality of life.



Working with the people who are important to you

The people that matter to you are important to us as these are the people who know you best.

We will listen to information that will assist us in getting to know you better, and in turn, we will hear where we can improve your well-being by supporting tasks such as administration or budgeting. We can also accompany you on clinical visits, noting essential information and assisting you to communicate this to other clinicians and your extended support network.

The Tynwald Community service worked with me supporting my GP advice, slowly I felt better, became more confident. I have now started short trips on my own to see friends again. It's wonderful. Respite Care

Tynwald offers respite and welcomes guests who require a short or extended stay away from home.

- · Convalescence post-operative care
- On discharge from hospital care
- · While family and friends cannot offer support for a short period
- · To explore if residential care is a suitable option
- · To alleviate social isolation

Tynwald Club

The Tynwald Club is open for anyone that doesn't fit the standard daycare model.

Located at Tynwald Residential Home, the club supports local people who may be socially isolated or need a time out from their usual day-to-day activities.

The bespoke service allows socialising with people living at Tynwald and facilitates participation in the daily programme, including all meals and activities.

This service is a home-from-home experience seven days per week.

Monday to Saturday between 10am and 6pm. Sundays between 11am and 3pm.

Tynwald Tool Box

Small household maintenance tasks can often be difficult for older adults or people with disabilities, especially those without close neighbours or family. Our Tynwald maintenance team is on hand to help with odd jobs around the home.

Minor repairs

Changing light bulbs, putting up curtain rails, shelves and pictures, fixing loose carpets and leaking taps, or cleaning gutters and replacing broken glass. No job is too small.

Safety measures

Fitting smoke alarms, carbon monoxide detectors and grab rails.

Home security

Supplying and fitting door and window locks, door chains and door viewers or key safes.

Energy efficiency checks

Installing draught excluders, radiator heat reflectors and energyefficient lightbulbs.

Our service can make a significant difference to older adults, supporting them to live independently for longer. We can assess your home's maintenance needs externally and internally, forming a priority action plan for you to consider; this may include more significant work to ensure your home stays problem-free.

We can also support you if you choose to move into care by preparing your home for resale to ensure you get the best possible offer from your estate agent.
